Message from the Chairman Desk,

VIKASANA is a non-profit entity established in the year 1988-89 focusing on community development activities in five villages of Amruthapura Village of Tarikere Block. Today it has extended its territory of working area to two districts in Karnataka. Over the years Vikasana has been working under various community development programs such as - Children rehabilitation through bridge school program by ensuring basic education and overall healthy development; Safeguard child rights by creating knowledge and awareness among rural communities; Empowering the rural women through formation of SHGs and federations and encouraging savings and linking with micro-finance; Strengthening and empowering the Elected women representatives; Empowering and strengthening the tribal communities ensuring sustainability through formation of Farmer Producer Companies, skill development and income generation activities with the support of NABARD for seven long years; Organising and strengthening the rural youth with various skill development programs/ trainings.

In addition to these activities Vikasana has shown its keen focus on community health sanitation, food security, nutritional enhancement, safe drinking water through promotion of bio-sand water technology, promotion of herbal medicine, creating awareness and knowledge about various diseases like Malaria, Dengue, COVID19, Personal Hygiene, and various contagious diseases. Apart from these Vikasana has been working for clean environment by promoting organic agriculture, resource conservation, watershed development, natural resource management, drought relief measures, bio-diversity conservation, carbon reduction, tree plantation and ground water management program. Vikasana has never stepped back from its service to the needy community even during the recent medical emergency due to COVID-19, the organisation and the entire team kept working and ensuring the service to the most under privileged communities.

Furthermore, Organization is maintaining good-rapport with various stakeholders, government departments like Women & Child Welfare, Labour, Handicraft, Department of Empowerment of differently abled and senior citizen, KVK and Agriculture departments.

In the upcoming years Vikasana aims on collaboration with Women & Child Welfare Department focusing towards child welfare, women empowerment, fight against domestic violence and child marriage, ensuring skill development programmes for vulnerable women, youth and children. In addition to this Vikasana also aims towards extending its services to natural resource management, disaster management.

Programmes 2019-2020

1. Poor or Dropout Children Education Programme:

VIKASANA is working for underprivileged, dropout, poor, rural and orphan children through the education programme from past 27 years. Organisation has been engaged in ensuring holistic development and free basic education with residential facilities for these children at our two children center. The children in these centers are exposed to educational gap due to child labours working in agriculture sector, brick line, coffee estate, school drop outs, domestic worker, street children, orphan, single parent, migrant parents, and children from marginalized and poor families. Thus, the education program has been planned and implemented based on pedagogic methodology through which the education for the underprivileged children has been ensured. Our institution has always aimed at ensuring the holistic development of the child through rehabilitation, healthy practices, exposure to sports & cultural, computer skills, learning through experience and mainly bridge building the educational gap among these children.

a) Children Center – K. Chattanahalli (Anna Schmidt School partnership programme):

In the academic year 2019-20, thirty children were accommodated and rehabilitated for their continued education at K. Chattanahalli children center with the support of **Karl Kübel Stiftung for Child and Family, Germany** and **Anna Schmidt School, Frankfurt, Germany**. These children were identified from 30 economically backward villages of Chikmagalur and Shimoga district. The main objective of this programme is to provide a space for education, good environment for the holistic development of the underprivileged children from rural communities.

The children at the centre are free to access to the availing resources like free shelter, nutritional food, free education support from trained teachers, learning materials, teaching aids, computer training, playing materials, cultural exchange, and opportunity to learn and explore their talents and so on, for their inter personal development. In regard to the quality aspects at the center, we have adopted child friendly campus with strict child protection policy, regular monitoring systems are used to protect the child's need, care and protection all these has contributed in the overall well being of all children. All children at the center are regular to school, studying well and passed in their annual examination.



b) Infrastructure development programme at K. Chattanahalli Children center:



The children programme at K. Chattanahalli is supported by **Karl Kübel Stiftung for Child and Family, Germany** and **Anna Schmidt School, Frankfurt, Germany**. With their constant support and encouragement the activities at children center are functioning very well. This year with the support of **Karl Kübel Stiftung for Child and Family, Germany** we were able to develop the infrastructure facilities at the center. In this financial year we were able to install four computer systems and five bunker cots for the children.

These updated infrastructures have helped the children have better access to the facilities at the center.

The basic computer training is liked by all children and are very interested in learning, this is been creating a new learning to all children with better access to advance education. Installation of five bunker cots at the center has created a better place for sleeping for all the children and this has helped to maintain the distance from each cot and also has contributed to the health and hygiene of each child. c) Bridge school Duglapura (Asha for Education):



Asha for Education - Bridge school children programme is located at Duglapura village which is 13km distance from Tarikere block. This children center is running by VIKASANA with the support of **ASHA for Education, Seattle**. The center is ensuring educational support to 25 children who had educational gap due to various reasons and also children from economical poor backward families. An importance is also given to nurture systematic daily routine, educational progressive activities and extra curriculum initiatives aiming at overall development of all

children. The institution has been ensuring free education with residential facility up to SSLC i.e. 10th grade.

Children are also given additional skill based education like basic computer training, there are four computers and a trained teacher to guide them basic computer skills, apart from this there is small library with minimum of 250 to 300 books which children can use to gain their knowledge. The institution has been ensuring the holistic development of the child with the child friendly

approach. During the year infrastructure development like installation of CC Camera, construction of washing areas and new kitchen room with the support of individual donors.

d) Land development programme in Duglapura (Asha for Education, Seattle):



The team of VIKASANA has been constantly working on the development activities and utilization of land supported by ASHA for education, Seattle. The land was supported with the objective to run sustainable bridge school education to the most needy and backward children in rural region.

This year we have received an average rainfall in the beginning of the monsoon which has helped in involving in agricultural land

development activities. As a result of it we were able see some progressive growth in the land development activities. The plantation of teak and silver plants has grown more vertical as well as horizontal. In addition to that we have planted few more forestry plants like silver, teak and gliricidia in the edges of land field. Whereas the horticulture plants such as banana, sapota, mango, neem and areca nut plants to nurture the nature. On the other hand, we cultivated vegetables like brinjal, cucumber, pumpkin, ladies finger, tomato, coriander, bottle gourd, herbs, beans and chilly.

Through these land development activities we are generating income from vegetable cultivation, coconut plants, tamarind plants and banana cultivation. Income earned from this land is utilized for the management of Bridge school expenses and management of land. In next five years we are expecting the sustainability of the land so that the children center and support to 25 needy children for their education will be possible with the support of earnings from the agricultural land.



2. Sustainable Resource Conservation and Food Security for Low Income Families:

Sustainable resource conservation and Food security project is effectively implementing by VIKASANA. The objective of this project is to bring reduction of poverty and increase average household food security of low-income families living in 14 backward villages of Tarikere block. The project was started in September 2019 and is successfully going on with the financial support from Karl Kübel Stiftung (KKS/BMZ) Germany.



Around 1000 Low income families has been benefiting from the project intervention. We have formed CBOs such as SHGs, and WDCs which are effectively functioning and are strengthened. The savings habit of women has increased from day to day. Due to series of training/exposure visit, the knowledge of beneficiaries on social issues as well as government schemes has improved and they are accessing them now. Besides, they understood the importance of people participation in village development. 25 farmers adopted organic farming/Cultivation and importance to soil and water conservation was improved better as a result of various training, meeting, home visit followed by sustainability orientation/initiatives. As a result, farmers are keep continued the organic farming strategies in their agriculture land along with utilization of watershed treatments implemented.



Implementation of various income generation activities are already in place and people are earning additional income from management of IGA activities (Sheep/Goat rearing, Dairy, Petty shop, & Local chicks). Similarly beneficiaries are very happy to use the alternative energy sources activities supported by the project and the benefits experienced by them. Health status of beneficiaries is improving day to day due to use of best practices connected to the health and sanitation management followed by awareness generation. The Farmers and beneficiaries are now come forward to take over the activities to its sustainability.

Key milestones:

- 22 SHGs and 01 WDC functioning independently and standing for savings, social justice and collective action
- 40 training Programmes are organised with almost 1200 participants – information and knowledge on food security, nutrition, sustainable agriculture and water conservation improved as a result of training and capacity building has been shared among them.
- IGP Activities – 04 units Mushroom cultivation unit, 07 units of Dairy Development, 02 units of Sheep rearing, 01 Petty Shop, 20 units of poultry. Result of these activities 31 members who got additional work to generate extra incomes to sustain their family.
- 310 acres of land have been developed under the dry land /watershed project and treated with erosion control, soil and water management measures.
- 168 Families received improved access to 40 units of food storage device, 60 units of solar energy, 14 units of safe cooking chullas and 40 units of safe drinking water and are now been utilized effectively.



- Sustainable resource conservation and introducing organic farming - 30 units of Vermicompost and 20 Bio-fertilizers are implemented among the local farmers under integrated pest management measures. This has resulted in reduction in use of chemical fertilizers into the agricultural land. 50 families are now using organic farming this has increased the soil fertility and the yield is slightly progressing.
- 20 Azola units have been implemented to support dairy development. The milk yield has been increased, used as a nutritious food for the cow and the cost on fodder has been reduced.
- 44 days of Tank desiltation programme has been successfully carried out and removed 572 loads of sand from the tank, around 50 acres of dry land is now been now fertilized with and the agricultural yield has been improved.
- 01 Free Animal Health Camp was organised for the benefit of the farmers around 63 cow, 28 Ox, 19 Buffaloes, and 76 Sheep were checked and free medicine was distributed and local

veterinary doctor and the doctors team was part of the event. This has resulted in reduction in death rate, sickness among the cattle.

- Health, food, sanitation and nutrition activities – 10 units of Kitchen Garden which has benefited 15 to 20 families which has reduced the cost of expenditure on vegetables for 6 to 8 months and the nutrition of the family members has increased. 25 units of soak pit reduced insects and flays near housed and related sickness has also has been reduced.

- 02 tailoring centres are started to provide employment opportunity among the 40 young girls and women has created self employment opportunity, additional income and reduce in migration in search of job.

3. COVID -19 relief activities, KKS/VMZ, Germany:

Vikasana has been working in 20 villages in Tarikere block. During this COVID-19 situation and medical emergency, the entire country was shut down from middle of March which has affected mostly the migrant and daily labours. This has affected even our rural people for their livelihood, thus Vikasana team has taken initiatives in distributing food kits, mask, sanitizers, biscuit for children and also creating awareness trough distribution of posters. By the end of March 2020 Vikasana team was able to mobilize and distribute around 25 food kit and has been distributed to the very poor and needy individuals. Apart from distribution of food kits the staff team was more focusing on creating awareness on COVID protective measures and has



organised around 10 training programmes on preventive measures from COVID with participation of 1500 individuals.

4. Strengthening the Elected Women Representatives in Local Village Gram Panchayat:



With the support of The Hunger Project (THP)-New Delhi, VIKASANA is implementing the project titled “Strengthening the Political Leadership of Elected Women Representative [EWR] in Local Village Councils-Gram Panchayats so as to address the violence against women through the local governance framework” with covering 363 EWRs from 102 GPs from Tarikere, Mudigere and Kadur block of Chikmagalur district and Shikaripura and Bhadravathi block from Shimoga district. All

these EWRs are not only effectively working in their respective panchayat but are also actively monitoring the standing committees. They also understood the role of GPs in preventing sexual harassment and importance for women gram saba. Besides, EWRs are in regularly connected with school, mid-day meals, SDMC committee issues, anganwadi, bala vikasa samithi, mothers meeting, adolescents, pregnant women, lactating mothers, ASHA workers, ANM and monitoring the effective work to be reached to right beneficiaries.

Key Milestones:

- 10 Federation meeting at block level has benefited 354 EWRs and these federations are functioning as a common platform for women collective action.
- All together 20 Jagaruk Manch Meeting held in 5 blocks. 09 President, 02 Vice President, 46 members and 640 other women members were actively participated and discussed about local problems and development work through gram panchayath.
- 20 JVs are functioning in 05 blocks. The team of JV is also looking after the issues related to anganawadi, school, mid-day meals, medicines at hospitals, bribe at PHC, fair price shop and more. 20 JV meeting benefited by 162 women member who raise local issues and made strategic action plan to resolve them at the possible extent.
- SWEEP Film Screening Programme - conducted 33 Film screening programmes in 05 working blocks. 08 President, 04 Vice President, 24 Members, 1101 other women members and 52 men members were actively participated and benefited from this film screening programme.



- SWEEP Jatha (Rally) programme – organised 45 rallies through bike rally, bullock cart rally, and tractor and tiller rally to attract the people and convey the message. Around 11 President, 05 Vice President, 45 members, 1577 other women and 100 men participated.
- SWEEP Street Play programme - conducted 47 street play shows in working blocks around 11 President, 04 Vice President, 44 members, 8600 other women and 250 men were participated and benefited from this programme. This programme was also indirectly benefited to more than 6500 people.
- Sweep village Level Meeting - we have successfully conducted 125 Village level meetings. 09 President, 07 Vice President, 36 Members, 4549 other women members and 07 men were actively participated and benefited from these meetings
- 04 Need based workshop benefited by 142 EWRs. As a result, job application submitted by

400 women under MGNREGA, drinking water available in 105 villages (72 Shuddaganga Units), 110 separate toilets for women constructed in 05 blocks.

- Linkages to govt schemes and effective monitoring of local institutions by JV team.

- Connected various government schemes to 394 beneficiaries (Sandya suraksha scheme -130, Widow pension - 80, Old age pension -145, Handicap pension -16, Housing - 55, Electricity-40,

Land grant certificate – 75, PSD Card – 120, Agriculture equipments from Agricultural dept. – 20, Farm Pond from agricultural dept. – 25, National security scheme-12, Manasvini- 9 and Inter caste marriages - 05, Child enrolment to school - 15 and Linkages to residential hostel-52).

5. Farmers Producer Organisation (FPO) - NABARD:

In order to increase the agriculture produce and making farmers to sell their products through their own platform, VIKASANA is implementing Farmer Producer Organization Project with the financial assistance from NABARD, Bangalore. There are 03 FPOs namely - Sri Nisarga FPO-Begur, Sri. Annapoorneshwari FPO- Koppa and Sri Sharadamba FPO- Sringeri are functioning in three blocks of Chikmagalur district of Karnataka state. The programme activities of these FPOs are well going in project villages and these FPOs are registered under the Companies Act 1956. Training and capacity building of FPO directors and concerned team has been carried for more insight about FPO concept. Apart from training the FPOs are also focusing on equity mobilization, increase of shareholders and doing business activities such as selling of fertilizers, pesticide, aluminum ladder, tarpaulins and coffee drying mattress are going in the field.

6. Integrated Tribal Development Programme (TDF-NABARD):

VIKASANA implemented the “Integrated Tribal development programme” project in Koppa and Shringeri block from 2011 to 2018 with a view to ensure sustainable economic improvement of tribal communities. NABARD Bangalore has provided financial assistance to reach the development services to 603 Tribal families. Now, all these families have enrolled under the two FPOs in two clusters as shareholder farmers. The name of these FPO is Sri Annapoorneshwari FPCL and Sri Sharadamba FPCL. So far the farmers are availing various technical advices related to spices crops from these FPOs. Besides, they are availing the required agriculture inputs like tarpaulins, coffee bags, pepper ladder, sprayer machine and etc at reasonable price. Apart from that, these tribal share holder farmers are also selling their coffee, pepper, nutmeg and clove through these FPO platforms. Due to the existence of the FPO farmers are linked to better market and minimized interference of middleman.

7. Promotion of Bio-sand water technology:

With the objective of provide safe and sustainable drinking water to rural households, VIKASANA implemented Bio-sand water filters project in 03 villages of Kalkere Gram panchayath, Kadur block, Chikmagalur district. A financial assistance and technical guidance supported by People for progress in India (PPI), Seattle, WA. 151 Beneficiaries supported under this project are happily drinking the bio-sand filtered water that made reduction of waterborne diseases. It was also ensured continuous availability of safe purified bio-sand water for better living condition of these rural lives. Still we are promoting the awareness on bio-sand water filter technology during all our awareness programmes. Apart from that, every year, we are manufacturing and marketing of BioSand water filters to the needy community based on their need and requirement.

8. Micro finance through SANGAMITRA FINANCE:

VIKASANA has continued its association with SANGAMITRA FINANCE; mobilized linkage services to SHGs taking consideration of further sustainable development. 03 SHGs in 03 villages of Tarikere blocks were received total INR.6,50,000.00 as loan and is been invested on children education, house construction, toilet construction, income generation means, dairy development, livestock, horticulture development, fruit crops, agriculture and economical improvement activities. Repayment of the loan in regular intervals is in its process. Financial situation of local women SHG members has been improving day by day.

9. Promotion of handicrafts design and development:

In order to ensure the promotion and development of disappearing traditional handicrafts in rural villages aiming at the benefit of needy artisans community; VIKASANA is implementing a **AHVY and Non AHVY Schemes** in Chikmagalur district, Karnataka with the grant support from **office of development commissioner (Handicrafts), Mangalore**. Formation of 14 artisans groups, baseline study of 229 artisan's families, design and technical development workshop, large group discussion, development of identity cards for artisans were done by the organisation. Rs.72,000/- amount savings and Rs.3,50,000/- given as a loan from Sanghamithra Finance for the IGA activities especially for development of Bamboo craft.

10. Formation of Self Help Groups:

VIKASANA has given primary importance to organise women representation in to self servicing groups. 21 New women Self Help Groups (SHGs) has been formed newly in our working area during this year. They all are functioning independently with the savings management. Besides, capacity building and strengthening services rendered to almost 115 formed



SHGs in 56 villages and who pool their thrift regularly and use the thrift to make small interest bearing loans to members. Credits made people to receive additional money from adopted income generating programmes like Dairy, Goat /Sheep rearing, starting of self employment and even for family needs like marriages and festival celebrations. Several groups are registered and have obtained financial assistance from the Banks, NABARD RO, Sangamitra finance and Local Banks. Initiatives invited to make these groups as permanent existence in project villages for further development, sustainability of the project activities and collective action.

11. IGP & Entrepreneurship development:



To sustain the rural livelihood and to ensure self employment habits among the rural communities, VIKASANA has been supporting and encouraging towards income generation and entrepreneurship management activities for **850** poor and low income families living in 20 villages of drought prone region of Kadur block, 26 villages in Koppa and Sringeri and 10 villages in Tarikere block.

These self employment initiatives improved the financial conditions of target families' thereby reduced in seasonal migration. Training and capacity building program on income generation programme, entrepreneurship development, marketing, networking, book keeping, account maintenance and strengthening leadership skills provided to the people. The intrusion provided additional income to rural families and relieved them from the clutches of local money lenders. Average additional family income was recorded between INR.1500 to INR. 4500 per income generating programme for each family.

12. Promotion of Herbal Medicines:

Vikasana has been promoting herbal medicines and encouraging the traditional medicines among the communities. We still extended our efforts to encourage the practices of traditional/herbal medicines to control dependency on high cost English medicines in project villages. The key activities such as awareness generation, exhibition on herbal medicine, identification of local Nativaidyaru (Traditional doctors) and medicinal services were benefited to 150 people from KKS supported Food security project. Still the rural nativaidyaru have rendered services to large number of people who victim of disease either from cough, cold, gastric and many others. Besides, herbal garden development and maintenance as well as conservation of medicinal plants were other key crucial areas focused.



“Promotion of Herbal medicines – Introduction to medicinal plants and Practical classes”

Achievements:

- In total 05 trainings were called in working villages focusing on preparation and applying traditional medicine, evidence was given to take care on treatment and observe regularly.
- 02 Herbal medicine exhibitions organized and 87 beneficiaries such as SHGs member and traditional practitioner have clearly understood herbal medicine for various diseases.
- 35 Representatives from different organization have updated their knowledge on preparation of herbal medicines followed by a course training and engaged with experimenting learns from training
- Information provided not only medicines for human diseases but also to livestock
- A hand book on herbal medicine with content of information regarding practice of Herbal medicines was shared with trainees

Other Activities of the Organization:

a. Support to Bagalkote, Karnataka Flood affected area:



Vikasana is always open to render their free service to the communities in need of support, likewise this year when North Karnataka states was completely affected by flood and the entire state was in complete water, the basic amenities was at stake. The availability of food and clothing was very difficult. Mainly the rural families were left no homes and their houses were washed away. Looking at the

situation and understanding the need for food and clothing Vikasana was able to get in contact with REACH Organisation working as an NGO cum Childline. Vikasana was able to mobilize items like - Coconut Oil, Washing Soap, Bath soap, Rice, Bed Sheet, Bed Spread, Cloths for children, Cloths for men, Cloths for women, Bags, Towel, Biscuits for children, Candles, Match box, Mosqitoo Coil, and Sanitary napkins from various source, individual donors, local individuals and church representatives. All together around 8 bags were sent to REACH NGO at Bagalkote, Karnataka State. A small contribution from us had made immense difference to the needy communities and children to fight against their situation.

b. International Women’s Day Celebration:

Vikasana is working for the women empowerment and equal rights since 1988, strengthening of women representatives is an ongoing programme initiated by Vikasana through the support of The Hunger Project, New Delhi. This year Women’s Day Celebration was with the EWRs in collaboration with the team of JV Members were actively took part in this programme and made the day a very great celebration to all the women and a team of

VIKASANA had also taken part in Taluk level programme by displaying VIKASANA stall with its activities, organic products, herbal medicines and IEC materials displayed. The programme of women day was independently was organised by JV and EWRs taking the assistance from local people and local resources, besides during the programme the members got an opportunity to share about their achievements at their GO level and any problems related was taken to government officials on the same day.

c. One day training on documents and minimum standards as per JJ Act at Children center at Chikmagalur organised by ICPS:

Vikasana has been recognised as fit institution and has been registered under JJ Act. As per the new rules / circular from the department of women and children there are some required /specified documents which need to be maintained for each child residing at the children center and certain standards should be maintained in CCI recognised by JJB. So there was one day workshop was organised for the director, teaches, counsellors and children welfare committee members of the organisation was held at District Training Center, Chikmagalur. Vikasana team which included teachers, counsellors and staffs had also taken part in this one day training programme along with Mr. Varghees Cleatas, the chairman of Vikasana.

d. One day workshop on Child rights and Children law for Vikasana Bridge School Children

In present world children are exposed to lot of good and bad experience and most of the time children are unaware of which is good to them and which is not. Many children in our society still silent about the exploitation they undergo in this common society, So the need to empower our children at children center was very important. Thus Vikasana team had organised one day interactive session with

the children was organised at K. Chattanahalli for Vikasana Bridge School Children, Mr. G N Simha CHILDINE, Bagalkote, Mr. Varghees Cleatas Chairman – VIKASANA and Mr. Srinivas Vikasana Staff were invited as Resource person for the workshop. The Key objective of this workshop was to create awareness among the children about their Rights, How to safeguard their rights, whom to approach when their rights have been violated, what does the Indian law say about children and their rights, Various laws framed specially for their protection like Prohibition of Child Marriage Act, Children (Pledging of Labour) Act, Child Trafficking, Child begging, POCSO and so. Creating awareness about the children law and their rights was the key objective of this workshop.

e. Food grains distribution by food and citizen supply department:

VIKASANA is receiving food grains by food and citizen supply department under Kalyana Samsthe Yojane (Welfare organisation project) from central government since 2016. For the welfare of children, every month the food department is distributing 10 kg rice and 5 kg wheat to

each child staying at VIKASANA children bridge school, Chattanahalli. This was benefited and enabled VIKASANA organisation to supply adequate quality and quantity of food supply for the needy children.

f. Bio Sand Water filter construction techniques and Promotion – Friendly Water, Dindigal:

Mr. A M Varghees Cleatas, Chairman/ Project Director had participated in Bio Sand Water Filter Training Programme held at Dindigul from 25th to 29th June 2019 by Friendly Water. The training programme was very informative about the use of Bio sand water filter which is a scientifically proved natural water filtering technology which has been experimented and approved. The same model was introduced during this training programme; a practical training was also given about the construction of the filter, a detailed information about the combinations to be used for building the filter was explained with theory and practical classes. VIKASANA was already involved in promoting bios sand water filters among rural and urban, this training was more helpful to learn about the advanced/ improved techniques in building the filter. The training has given more knowledge once again sincere thanks Friendly Water team for creating opportunity for learning.

g. Two days training programme on Bio Sand water filter training and Demonstration-

From 2014 Vikasana has been promoting Bio-Sand water Filter, as the extended activity during this year in the month of January we had taken an initiative to organise two days training programme for the various representatives from the networking agency on the use of Bio – Sand water filter, advantages and also practical classes on how to construct a good quality Bio – Sand water filter. There were twenty participants from five NGOs namely – Chinthana Foundation, CARD Kushal Nagara, REACH Bagalkote, Vidyaniketha Bengaluru and Vikasana Tarikere. The training was more effective and more an interactive and practical experience.

h. Visit by KKS Donors Team:

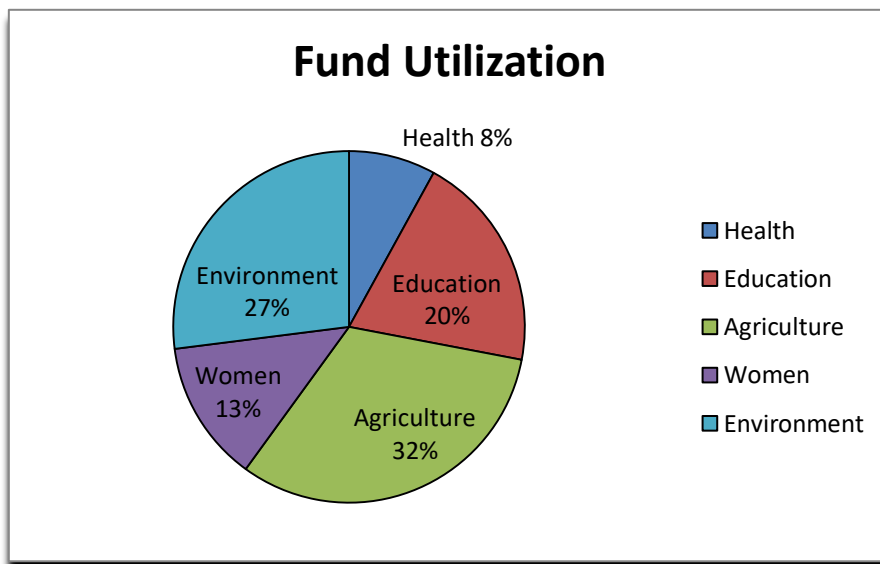

I. Networking of NGOs:

VIKASANA is in the forefront of networking of NGOs in the state. VIKASANA has made the organization familiar with the networking system. It has been leading several small NGOs and networks in and around Chikamagalur district. It has its added credibility of being one of active and supportive NGO in Campaign against Child Labour – Karnataka (CACL–K) and FEVORD-K. It has also hosted few major state and district events that were aimed at bringing as many as NGOs and individuals to strengthen the movement of grassroots development activities.

VIKASANA has been instrumental in taking up Campaigns and networking on Child Labour in the district and the state, had taken up cases against child labour in Chikamagalur district. The organization is extending its support for the change in the policy to care for the weaker sections of the society and joining hands with the government in the development process. On several occasion the organization had taken strong decisions against some of locally instigated mischief by the vested interests. It is evident from the statement of local community that VIKASANA had to face challenges to the welfare of the women and downtrodden and convinced the people and the society that the organization is going in the right direction of development process.

Impact Success Stories through the intervention of VIKASANA:

1. Success Story of Bridge School Children center –



“Ms. Supritha receiving her Graduation Honours”

Ms. Supritha joined Children center at the age of seven, she was very small but was malnourished, and exhausted from his hard work in brink manufacturing unit. She had infections in throat Vikasana had taken initiative to get her treatment through local contribution. She was joined to 2nd standard and was given training on basic education. She was trained at Vikasana children center up to 8th grad later her family took initiative to continue her education. During her journey at children center she was engaged in Bridge building course, under which she was trained to read, write, learn with games, identification of words, alphabets,

learning numbers and so other interesting and innovative activities. When she was studying in class 7 her father was paralyzed and became bed ridden, so her mother wanted to take her back home because of the family situation. But her family supported her in studies, she secured 65% in her SSLC, later was joined to PCMB for her Pre-university where she secure 78%. Later with the support of her brothers she completed her Nursing training at Nirmala Nursing School at Bhadravathi. She completed her nursing with distinction and with 2 rank at the nursing school. Presently she is working as a tutor at same institution. We are very proud about her achievement. We would like to extend our warm gratitude on behalf of Ms. Supritha, her family and from Vikasana team to all the donors who had supported her during her difficulties and for being a reason for her success.

2. Eco friendly toilets and developed hygienic atmosphere:

Nagarathna w/o Somasheker is a resident of B.Kavalahatti village of Kadur Block. Her family consists of five members and she lives in a house in the center of the town together with her two daughters and her parents. She runs a Kindergarten during the daytime. Due to it was not possible for her and her family to go to toilet during the daytime. They needed to wait for the night to use the area around the village. That affected their health very much. Also because of the excrements around the village the spread of diseases like Malaria was very easy and happened regularly. 4 years back she was selected in the SHG from B.Kavalahatti to get support for one ECO FRIENDLY TOILET by Vikasana. She took part in a governmental training and took 2000 Rupies loan from the SHG to pay the own part of 25%. They saved 500 through digging the hole by themselves. The remaining 7500 were managed by Vikasana with support of KKS from Germany. Since the construction they have a functioning toilet, which they can use during the daytime. That avoids the spread of diseases and they have always a clean toilet. They save indirectly 8000-9000 Rupies of medical expenses they had to pay before for the hospital.



She even motivates her children to use the toilet regularly and not

use the surrounding area- That avoids health problems and increases the appearance of the village. They had no problems with the toilet during the last 4 years and Nagarathna is very happy about it. Even about the support of Vikasana, because she wouldn't had built it without the support and still struggle with her health.

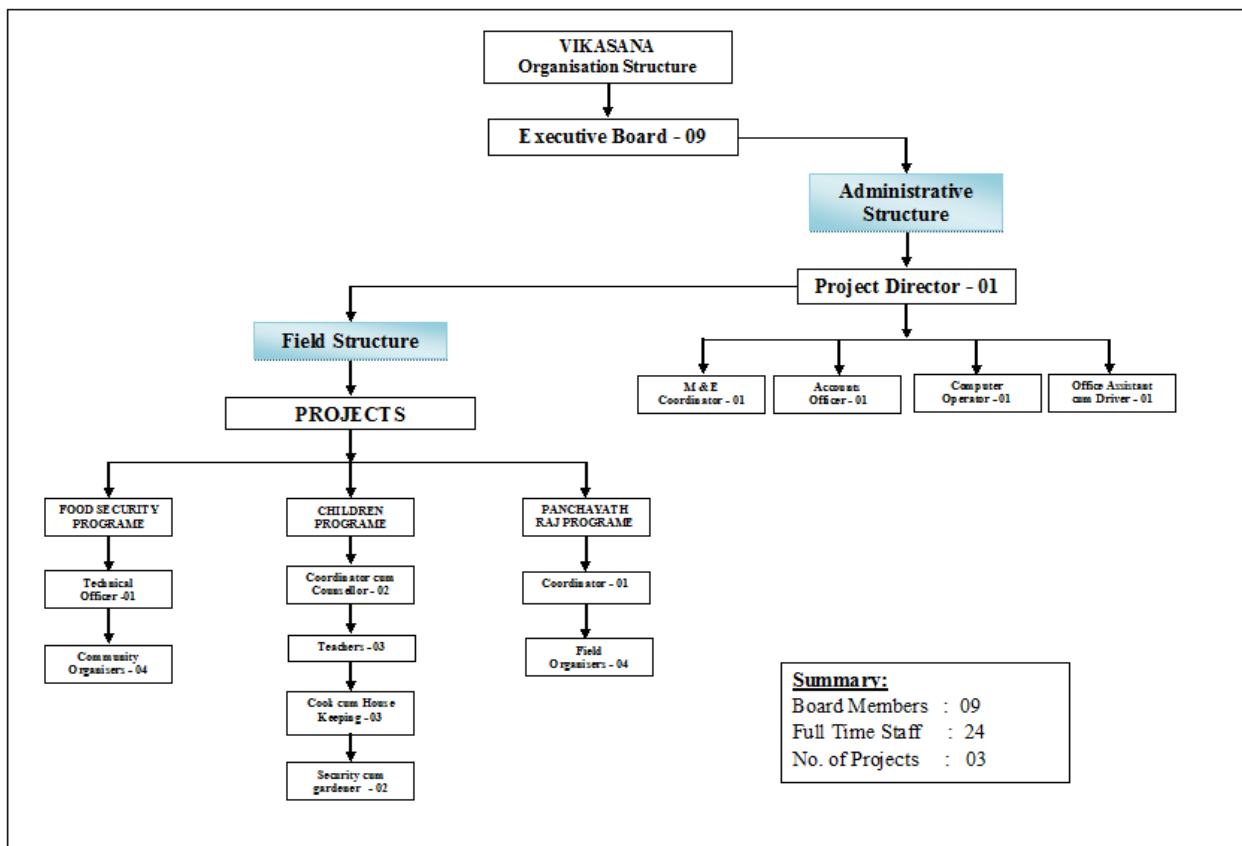

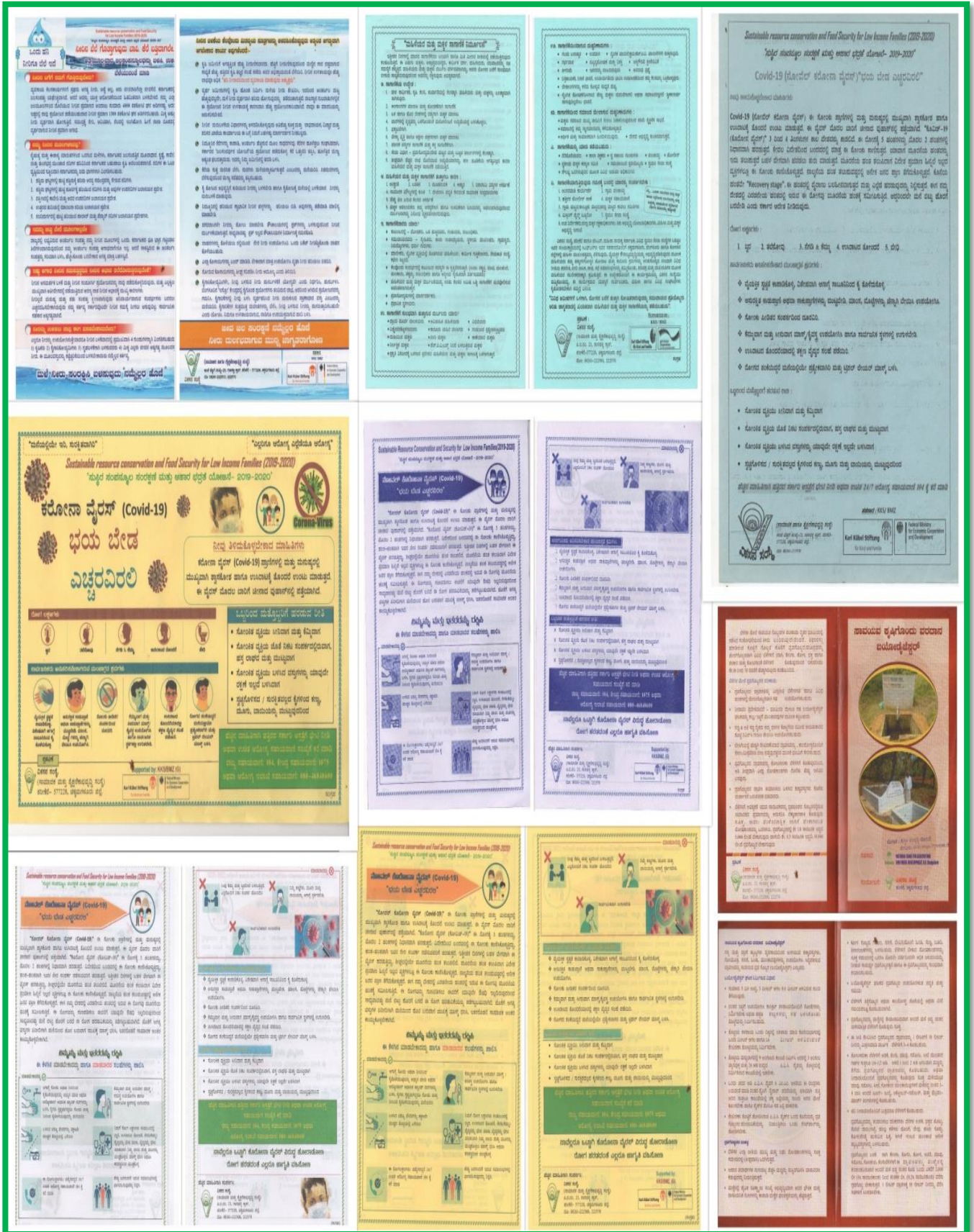
Organisation structure and management details 2019-20:
